

New Postoffice Out.

SENATOR McNARY has written Postmaster Cox that it is impossible to do anything about a new postoffice for Heppner at this time, because it does not come in the classification of cities eligible for new postoffices. Only cities having postal receipts in excess of \$10,000 a year are in the eligibility class, and receipts here do not reach that

That's the law; so Heppner must forget about getting a new postoffice until receipts make our city eligible. That there's no rhyme nor reason to any such law makes no difference to Mr. McNary, nor does it seem to make any difference to

anyone else.

This law like so many other laws of our government takes no cogni-zance of need or economy. Under our present governmental set-up each department is a government unto itself, and it were sacrilege for one department to have anything to do with another department.

In other words, the postoffice de-partment may build postoffices—in places where receipts exceed \$10,-000; or some other department may build a building, or do anything else it pleases where conditions meet regulations; but there is no way of coordinating the work of the postoffice department with that of any other department so that Uncle Samuel may build to meet the needs of the various depart-ments in a given community. Or at least that seems to be the an-

Heppner's claim for a postoffice was not based solely on the need for a postoffice. It was shown that federal agencies in the city were spending enough for rent to justify the expenditure of some \$30,000 for a building to house the several agencies. Naturally such expenditure would provide more adequate facilities for conducting the government's business, besides provid-ing protection for valuable records records the replacement of which

would cost many thousand dollars.

Before going too far with its tax
program, the New Deal should investigate the probable saving which appears could be made by coordin-ating the work of the several departments to avoid duplication of expense. It may be that opportunity would thus be afforded Mr. Roosevelt to turn the laugh on those who have been kidding about the said tax program.
