SINCE the United States circuit court this week ruled the processing tax on agricultural products unconstitutional, general alarm is felt in this section as to what may happen to the wheat production control program.

OSC Food Preservation Bulletin Now Revised

To give Oregon home-makers the most up-to-date assistance in preserving fruits, vegetables, meats and fish for winter use, a revised edition of Extension Bulletin No. 450, "Home Food Preservation," has been prepared by Oregon State college specialists.

Among the many new features of the revised publication is the discussion of methods of obtaining fuller jars, through hot-packing instead of cold-packing foods, and sealing before processing.

The new bulletin contains directions for canning meats, fish, poultry, vegetables and fruits, either in tin or glass, and the various methods recommended for each.

Directions and illustrations are also included for constructing home-made driers, racks for boilers, for making a small smoke-house from a barrel, and for making a storage pit for vegetables.

Copies of the new bulletin No. 479 may be obtained free from the state college, or from county extension offices.
