agent of Sherman county. In cattle, Ralph Neill was declared champion showman and in sheep Elwynne Peck was the winner of this honor. Again this year, the 4-H hamburger and hot dag stand was operated during the evening outside the dance pavilion for the purpose of raising funds to send Morrow county 4-H club livestock to the state fair. A number of men in the county gave unselfishly of their time to make this booth a success. Thnrdsday night was Morrow county court night with Judge Bert Johnson and Commissioners Geo. Peck and Roy Neill serving hot dogs with or without mustard in a surprisingly professional style. Friday night Oral Scott, Marion Finch, Orville Cutsforth and Ellwynne Peck helped to serve mud, while on Saturday night Vawter Parker, Victor Peterson, Harry Tambyln, George Peck and Orville Cutsforth were successful in persuading a large part of Morrow county that the 4-H club booth served more vitamins and more calories in their sandwiches than any other place in town. Bert Peck spent the better part of three days in building the club booth, acting as superintendent of the grain show and assisting in arranging the barns to accommodate livestock. Valuable assistance was given by Adolph Majeske and Clarence Biddle both before and during the fair, by Frank Edmondson in arranging the wool show, and Harold Cohn in clerking during the sheep judging.
