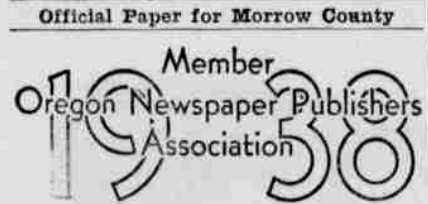

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It's Morrow County's Show

TO PRODUCE a parade in New York or Chicago such as that seen in Heppner Saturday would cost a good many thousand dollars, and in a large eastern metropolis such a parade would be a sensation. But because we in Morrow county are so well acquainted with so many of the people and animals participating we are prone not to appreciate it to its full value.

Maybe not in these exact words, but in sense at least, did Judge Bert Johnson comment on what he believed to be one of the finest attractions ever presented to the public in this county.

Because Judge Johnson heads the county government, his opinion is quoted with editorial emphasis and okeh, not only regarding the parade but Rodeo in its every feature.

He said the boys who directed the Rodeo association in its every department are entitled to full public recognition, approval and approbation for putting on a good, clean show, representative of the county, a show in which all parts of the county participated; and so we give you Henry Aiken, president; Len L. Gilliam, secretary; directors A. J. Vey, Lee Beckner, Dr. R. C. Lawrence, E. R. Schafer and L. E. Bisbee, who headed the association; Logie Richardson, parade director, and Frank Alfred, heading the ticket sales, and the numerous loyal assistants without whose aid success of the show would not have been possible.

So worthwhile was the excellent showing of 4-H club work that Judge Johnson reports the court is considering possibilities of enlarging and improving quarters for this feature of Rodeo. Roy Robinson's showing of his purebred Herefords was a mighty fine addition to the fine showing of the boys and girls, the judge emphasized.

But to diverge momentarily. Joe Belanger, who handled the club show, has expressed his appreciation for the help given by the Rodeo association. Not only did the association contribute the sandwich stand at the dance pavilion, a valuable spot in revenue before it was given to the 4-H club to help raise money to send 4-H exhibits to

the state fair, but Eldon Schafer, concessions head, personally helped clean up the pavilion for the exhibits, and the association gave all 4-H exhibitors free admission to the Rodeo proper.

As for Heppner's state band champions, Judge Johnson waxed very enthusiastic. These youngsters should go on to the regional, if not national championship this year, and the whole county should give them a hand in doing it, he said.

And so Morrow county has presented its 17th annual Rodeo successfully, living up to its name of "the biggest little show of sports of the Old West," the sports that live in true survival here in reality, and from memories in the hearts of many of her people.

No appreciation of the event would be complete, however, without an added word of tribute to those "good neighbor" friends from Grant, Gilliam and Umatilla counties whose interest and assistance with the show added the completing touch for an occasion of renewal of friendships and extension of good will.

Judge Johnson says let us perpetuate Rodeo as a Morrow county show. When the annual meeting is

Morrow County, Oregon, and duly filed for record by the Clerk of said County on the 26th day of July, 1938, which said Certificate is in the amount of \$28,320.09 being the amount then due and delinquent for taxes for the year 1937 and prior on which a period of three years has expired since the earliest date of delinquency of taxes levied and charged on any tax roll of Morrow County, Oregon, and on which there has not been paid two annual installments of such delinquent taxes, each installment being one-quarter of the taxes of the earliest year of delinquency, in accordance with Chapter 5, Oregon Laws, Special Session, 1935, as amended by Chapter 96, Oregon Laws 1937, and also the taxes on the 1936 and 1937 tax rolls, together with interest and costs thereon, upon real property situated in said County hereinafter described, which said respective parcels of real property were assessed respectively to you as is hereinafter set forth in this summons.
