Mrs. Jones, formerly Ola Straight, had just shot an eagle last Thursday. She stopped at the woodshed for wood on the way back to the house. Laying the gun on the chopping block and picking up an armful of wood, she reached to pick the gun up and as she did so the trigger apparently caught some place on her dress, for the gun went off, sending the shot into the thumb of the hand holding the wood.

Going to the house she wrapped the injury, but as blood flowed freely through the dressing, she made a tourniquet for the arm above. She then called the Brosnan farm and wrote a note for Mr. Jones, who was absent. John Brosnan brought her to the hospital in town and she underwent amputation of the injured digit. She spent Friday in the hospital and returned home Saturday. Her recovery from the accident is reported to be progressing rapidly.
