The placing of all wild life in Oregon, including fish and game, except salmon and steelhead in the Columbia river and certain coastal bays, under the control of the Oregon Game commission, with their propagation and taking regulated for recreational purposes, was advocated in a proposed amendment to the state constitution approved by the ing. gon Wild Life federation at Oregon State college December 1 and 2.

The amendment would close all bays and coastal streams in Oregon to commercial fishing except the Columbia river and parts of Coos, Winchester and Tillamook bays.
