Salem-Concensus of opinion among capitol observers is that there will be no change in the personnel of the state tax commission, for the time being at least. John Carkin, who was supplanted on the commission by Wallace S. Wharton, in an eleventh hour coup by Governor Martin and State Treasurer Holman, will probably be "taken care of" in some other department if capitol rumors are to be credited.

Just what berth has been picked out for Carkin is a matter of speculation. There is some talk to the effect that he might be named corporation commissioner if Governor Sprague should decide to make a change there which he is understood to be reluctant to do inasmuch as the incumbent, James Hazlett, although a Democrat, was an active Sprague supporter in the recent campaign. Carkin's name has also been linked with the post of utilities commissioner now held by N. G. Wallace, another Sprague Democrat. While Sprague is said to have no desire to oust Wallace the health of the utilities commissioner may compel his retirement from office in which event an opening would be made for some deserving republican.

While republican members of the Board of Control are known to resent the "sharp practice" resorted to by Martin and Holman in "packing" the tax commission with a Democratic appointee just before the new administration took over, it is said that they hesitate to remove either Wharton or Chas. V. Galloway at this time in order to make a place for Carkin lest they lay themselves open to the same criticism that has been directed at Martn and Holman for ousting Carkin to make a place for Wharton.
