**40 Million-Year-Old Fossil Found**

Oregon State College—A 40 million-year-old piece of fossilized palm tree trunk was found recently by Ray Cather, a farmer living near Berlin, Ore., while plowing in his field.

"According to my knowledge, it is the first specimen of palm found west of the Cascades in Oregon," Dr. Ethel I. Sanborn, associate professor of botany, said of the specimen. Dr. Sanborn had microphotographs taken to enable a better study of the plant.
