BE IT REMEMBERED, That County Court met in regular session at the Court House in Heppner, Oregon, on Wednesday the 3rd day of December, 1939, this being the regular time for holding a term of said Court, when were present: Bert Johnson, County Judge; George N. Peck, Commissioner; L. D. Neill, Commissioner; C. W. Barlow, Clerk; C. J. D. Bauman, Sheriff; Frank C. Alfred, District Attorney.

The minutes of the November, 1939 term were read and approved. In the Matter of Claims:

In the Matter of the Sale of Property of Arthur Reid c-o Martin Reid Seized for Delinquent taxes.


