**Famous Band Man
No Stranger Here**

Capt. Harry L. Beard, director of of the Oregon State college cadet band, is no stranger to Heppner. Although his visits have been few and far between, they have stretched over a long period of years, and his forthcoming visit here with his band will be his fourth appearance.

In 1909 Heppner staged a big Fourth of July celebration. In reality, that celebration was the forerunner of the Pendleton Round-Up, for Newt Jones put on a rodeo that attracted the attention of Pendleton business men who were casting about for a drawing card for the Morrow-Umatilla county fair and which resulted in the first annual Round-Up that fall. There were a few band musicians around town at the time and some of the band talent was in school at Corvallis. Captain Beard was induced to gather up nine or ten of his boys and bring them here for the three-day event. That was his first visit. A few years later he brought his college musicians here an a third visit was made just after the war.

The college band will arrive in Heppner March 17, Sunday, and will play two concerts on Monday, a matinee program for the school in the afternoon and the regular con-

cert in the evening, followed by a dance at the Elks hall.
