CCC Unit Building Highway Fire Breaks

A detachment of CCC boys working under J. L. Mills from the grazing service camp G-93 at Keating, is building fire breaks along the highway from Ione to Heppner Jet. Work started on April 8 and will be completed before dry weather starts, Mills stated.

A strip of land 20 feet wide is cleared of all inflammable material. The fire line is run an average of 150 feet from the highway and

weeds and dry grass will be burned off the highway to the break to protect adjacent grazing lands from fires such as destroyed thousands of acres of grass last year.

The fire breaks will be extended from Heppner Junction to Boardman, according to Mills, who states that this type of work is being done in many grazing areas to prevent fires from being started thru carelessness of smokers and other causes.
