

ITS THE CLIMATE

Mrs. Frank Rumble reports that the southern part of the United States has nothing on Heppner for winter climate. At her place in north Heppner she has read lettuce which was seeded in the fall and lived through the winter, as did a small patch of English peas. Further evidence of the mildness of the past winter is found in the fact that a butterfly bush, a decidedly tender plant, came through the winter unblemished by frost. She is permitting the head lettuce to go to seed in the hope that a hardy type of plant may be reproduced.

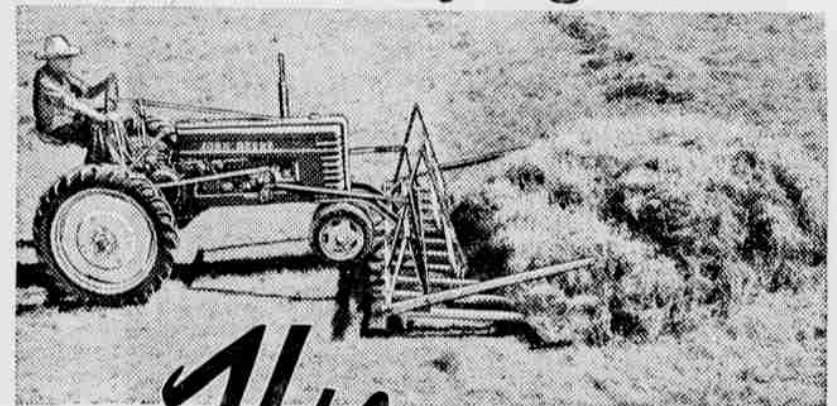
