



### Len Gilman Makes College 'Who's Who'

Pacific University, Forest Grove, Oct. 21.—Len Gilman, Heppner, was one of the six seniors chosen by the faculty committee to represent Pacific university in "Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges," a book published yearly listing the outstanding students on campuses throughout the country. Selection of students is based on character, student activities and individual accomplishments.

Gilman, a physical education major, was selected because of his outstanding contribution to Pacific University's athletics. During his four years here he has received the all-conference award at half-back in football for three consecutive years, and honorable mention on the Little All-American squad once. Other athletic awards include baseball and track. This year Gilman is president of the senior class. He is also a member of the Blue Key honorary fraternity, and Alpha Zeta fraternity.

The pilots who were discharged were equally competent to do good work other than combat service, it is insisted, and they had qualifications of training and experience which Elliott Roosevelt does not possess.
