Named are Long Creek at 8 a. m., Ukiah at 10 a. m., and Penleton at Round-Up grounds at 1 p. m. on that date. In the list of receiving stations from which release was given last week, The Dalles was the closest station given.

Breeders will be given preference over dealers in the purchases of horses for defense needs, says the release. All horses must meet specifications: gentleness; good flesh and good health; good movers at walk, trot and gallop; some breeding, either good rugged thorough-

Horses bought must be geldings, 4 to 8 years old; 15 to 16 hands in Mr. and Mrs. Marion Finch and height; 975 to 1,150 pounds; and bay, brown, black or chestnut in color. Prices range from \$150 to \$175. Owners are advised not to bring mares, as only very outstanding mares with registration papers will be considered.
