The tuberculosis test was given in various schools throughout the county April 28 Two hundred and eighty-five took the test and out of that number only five children and five adults were found to react positively. The persons reacting and 10tf. others who wanted to go, went to The Dalles May 6 and were fluoroscoped. Out of the 23 that were fluoroscoped only one had to be x-rayed. That shows Morrow county has been working on this disease. Early tuberculosis can be cured. Recovery from tuberculosis in the advanced stages is a tedious, expensive fight that often ends in death. That is the reason all persons in the community are urged to take this test when it is offered to the

Licenses Required to **Shoot Predators**

Licenses are now required to shoot or hunt non-game animals or predators, just as a license is neces-

sary to take game animals. This change came about through provisions of Senate Bill No. 147, granting power to the game commission to fix seasons and bag limits. Previously, the attorney general had ruled that no license was required for shooting of non-game animals or predators. The recently enacted legislation which, because of the emergency clause already in effect, makes it mandatory for any person to obtain a license before shooting any wild animals or pre-
