PROCLAMATION, WHEREAS,

the unregulated use of certain forest areas is, in the judgment of the State Forester, a menace to life and property due to conditions tending to cause or allow the rapid spread of fires which might occur or because of the inaccessible character of such areas due to the lack of suitable roads, and WHEREAS, upon the showing of the State Forester it appears to me necessary to close to unregulated use the following areas designated as: AREA NO. R-1: All National Forests in Oregon except the Siuslaw National Forest, and adjacent areas protected by the United States Forest Service as follows: All of T. 3 N., R. 36 E. outside Umatilla Indian Reservation; Ts. 3 & 4 N., R. 37 E.; E½ T. 5 N., R. 37 E.; T. 5 N., R. 38 E.; T. 5 N., Rs. 42 & 43 E. north and west of Grande Ronde River; E½ T. 6 N., R. 37 E.; T. 6 N., Rs. 38 & 42 E.; T. 6 N., R. 43 E. west of Grande Ronde River, except Secs. 13, 14, 23, 24 & 26; T. 1 S., R. 36 E.; Secs. 25, 26, 27, 34, 35, & 36, T. 2 S., R. 32 E.; Secs. 21 to 36 inc. T. 2 S., R. 33 E.; Secs. 1, 2, 11, 12, 13, 14, 24, & 36, T. 2 S., R. 35 E.; T. 2 S., R. 36 E.; Secs. 9 to 12, 30 & 31, T. 2 S., R. 37 E.; Secs. 31 to 36, T. 3 S., R. 29 E.; Secs. 23 to 26 & 31 to 36, T. 3 S., R. 30 E.; S½ T. 3 S., R. 30½ E.; S½ & NE¼, T. 3 S., R. 31 E.; T. 3 S., R. 32 E.; T. 3 S., R. 36 E. north of Grande Ronde River; T. 4 S., Rs. 29 to 32 E.; T. 5 S., Rs. 30 to 33 E., T. 6 S., Rs. 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 33, & 35 E.; T. 7 S., Rs. 27 and 28 E.; & Rs. 29 & 30 E. north of John Day River; Secs. 13, 14, 23, & 24, T. 8 S., R. 25 E.; Sec. 36, T. 8 S., R. 26 E.; T. 8 S., R. 27 E., except Secs. 32 to 36; and Secs. 1 to 10, 15 to 19, & 30, T. 8 S., R. 28 E. NOW THEREFORE, I, DEAN H. WALKER, Governor of the State of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of Section 107-210, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, do hereby proclaim the unregulated use of the above described areas to be unlawful and do hereby close said areas and the same shall be subject to use only upon condition that entrants shall comply with all of the following requirements or conditions: 1. To refrain from smoking while traveling in such areas, except on paved or surfaced highways. 2. To secure a permit issued by the forester or a fire warden before building a camp fire other than at improved, designated and posted camp grounds on such areas. 3. To have as a part of his or her equipment when using camp fires, except when traveling as a pedestrian, and-or camping at improved, designated and posted camp grounds, tools as specified by the forester as suitable for extinguishing fires. This proclamation shall be effective from and after the 1st day of July, 1941, and shall remain in full force and effect until and including the 31st day of December, 1941.
