Farm Labor Bill Takes Big Toll in Oregon

That the cash payment of Oregon farmers for labor runs into huge figures is shown by census reports now being studied by extension economists at Oregon State college. The 1940 census shows, for example, that in 1939 about half the farms in Oregon made a cash outlay of about \$16,000,000 for labor.

This figure includes reports from only about half the farms and does not include the value of board and living quarters frequently supplied, or payments made in the form of farm products. In 1939 the farm expense for labor accounted for approximately one-third of all the farm production costs. Since the farm labor supply has been reduced by defense conditions, it is known that farm labor rates are now nearly half again as high as they were in 1939, the extension economists point out.
