

EOCE 'Answer Please' To Give War Aid

Eastern Oregon College of Education, La Grande, Jan. 24.—An "Answer Please" service designed to answer written inquiries on a wide variety of civilian defense and other problems has been inaugurated at the Eastern Oregon College of Education, according to an announcement by Dr. Roben J. Maaske, president.

This "Answer Please" service is one way in which it was felt the Eastern Oregon college could contribute in a small way to our nation's all-out defense and war effort, as well as to provide a helpful professional service to elementary and junior high school teachers and school executives, and an educational service to adult men and women in the area served by the college.

The service will provide information on various problems of civilian defense and safety, professional problems of elementary school teachers and executives, questions of home and occupational interest for adults and will supply faculty speakers and student symposium discussion groups for special programs before various organizations in eastern and central Oregon upon payment of minimum travel expenses.

Resources of the college library, information of the college faculty members and specialists, plus added materials on civilian defense will be used in the "Answer Please" service.

NOTICE OF HEARINGS ON PETITIONS FOR THE FORMATION OF THE MID-COLUMBIA PEOPLES' UTILITY DISTRICT.

Notice is hereby given that three public hearings will be held by the Hydroelectric Commission of Oregon, the first hearing to be held on Friday, February 20, 1942, at 2:00 o'clock P. M., in the Circuit Court Room of the Court House in Moro, the second hearing to be held at 10:00 o'clock A. M. on Saturday, February 21, 1942, in the Circuit Court Room of the Court House in Ione, and the third hearing to be held at 3:00 o'clock P. M. on Saturday, February 21, 1942, in the Circuit Court Room of the Court House in Heppner, to consider the voters' preliminary petitions for the formation of the Mid-Columbia Peoples' Utility District, which petitions were filed in the office of the Hydroelectric Commission on December 27, 1941. The proposed district would include a parcel of territory and the municipalities of Arlington and Condon in Gilliam County, a parcel of territory and the municipalities of Heppner, Ione and Lexington in Morrow County, a parcel of territory and the municipalities of Grass Valley, Moro and Wasco in Sherman County, and a parcel of territory and the municipality of Fossil in Wheeler County.

Maps showing the boundaries of the proposed district are on file in the offices of the county clerks of the counties involved and available for inspection by persons interested.

The boundaries of the parcel of territory in Morrow County are described as follows:

Beginning at the northwest corner of T. 1 S., R. 23 E., W. M.; on the Morrow-Gilliam County Line, thence along section lines as follows: east 10 miles, south 1 mile, east 3 miles, south 2 miles, east 2 miles, south 1 mile, east 2 miles, south 1 mile, east 1 mile, south 1 mile, east 1 mile, south 1 mile, east 1 mile, east 1 mile, south 1 mile, east 1 mile, south 3 miles, west 2 miles, north 2 miles, west 1 mile, north 1 mile, west 1 mile, north 1 mile, west 1 mile, north 2 miles, west 2 miles, north 1 mile, west 2 miles, north 2 miles, west 2 miles, north 2 miles to the S.
