STAMP PLAN TO CONTINUE

The fact that the Food Stamp plan is going to continue was stressed today by Lincoln P. Bloomfield, acting area supervisor of the Surplus Marketing administration, in announcing the discontinuation of the use of continuation cards for retailers. Hereafter, all stamps received by retail merchants are to be placed on master cards only, for purposes of redemption. All continuation cards now in the hands of wholesalers and banks must be submitted to the Portland Audit office for redemption, Bloomfield said. "Some retailers have misunderstood this change in procedure to mean that the Food Stamp plan is going to fold up," he continued. "This is definitely not the case. The stamp plan is going to continue."
