IT ALWAYS HAPPENS ON PRESS DAY

This has been a busy week in the Gazette Times office, what with election drawing near and every-body wanting their job work but regardless of this fact the paper was well on the way to making the mail Thursday evening when the electric power was shut off. The shut-off occurred in the fore-noon and in about an hour was restored, only to remain long enough to get the linotype metal hot. Then there was another delay of two or three hours during which time the force tried to keep occu-pied. That is difficult to do in an office that depends so largely upon electric power and the result was that more than half of the day was lost.

It may not be entirely true but it is difficult to recall similar oc-casions that have not occurred on press day. Everything that can happen to the printer seems to come on that particular day.

Cause of the interrupted service was a blast set off by a highway crew working near the Pacific Power and Light company's high line below The Dalles. The load that was carried by the Hood River plant was shifted to the Tygh Valley plant which was unable to carry it, hence the second power shut-off.
