## Rationing Calendar

Clip and keep for handy reference. SUGAR

August 15—Stamp No. 13, book No. 1, good for five pounds, expires at midnight. Stamps No. 15 and No. 16 in war ration book one valid for 5 pounds of sugar each for home canning.

### COFFEE

June 30—Stamp No. 24, book No. 1, good for one pound expires at midnight.

### FUEL OIL

Sept. 30—Period 5 coupons valid March 26 through Sept. 30. Heating coupons—one unit, value 10 gallons; ten units, 100 gallons.

### GASOLINE

July 21—"A" books expire. No. 6 stamps in "A" books valid through this date.

### TIRES

Cars with B books must have tires inspected every 4 months; cars with C books, every 3 months. Cars with A books, every 6 months.

June 30—Red stamps J, K, L, M and N expire. Each weekly series good for .16 points.

July 7—Blue stamps K, L and M good through this date.

### SHOES

Oct. 31—Stamp 18, book 1, valid for one pair of shoes through stamps interchangeable among family living in same household.
