1943 CROP INSURANCE GOOD
Discontinuance by congress of the federal crop insurance program will not affect insurance on the 1943 wheat crop, hence insured Oregon growers will receive full protection on their crops through harvest, the state AAA office reported this week. Clyde Kiddle, crop insurance assistant, said that all losses to insured crops will be settled promptly and premiums will be collected on 1943 contracts. He reported that wheat crops on more than 4000 Oregon farms are insured this year.
