ROAD UP SHAW CREEK TO BE GRAVELLED

Seven miles of the Shaw creek road, from Willow creek to the summit, will receive a coat of gravel, according to Ranger F. F. Wehmeyer. The county, in cooperation with the bureau of public roads, will surface the road, the bureau providing funds and the county the work crew.

This should prove beneficial to hunters and others using the road, Wehmeyer opines.

DEER KILL LOWEST IN YEARS, RANGER STATES

Hunters have been numerous the first week of the deer hunting season, but early season kill has been the lowest in years, reports the local forest office. Up to Wednesday forenoon approximately 50 deer had been put into storage in Heppner, a number far short of the mark in recent years.

The shortage is attributed to the lack of time allotted to a large ma-

jority of the hunters, inasmuch as nearly everybody is employed these days and a brief week-end trip is all the time they can take. Shortage of gas rations also has to be taken into the picture and in all there will be at least 25 percent less venison in city lockers this fall than previously.
