You see when a fellow in the army gets a letter it is different than it would be any place else—it is a genuine production of that morale stuff that our special service officers, "propagandists," are trying to shoot into our arms, so to speak. It just sort of reminds us of a life that is not only behind us, but also ahead and well worth working for.

It's not a "bunch of hooey," I've been in long enough to know, and I've seen the difference between fellows that get letters and those who don't. Living in this entirely new environment can make a fellow change, and for the worse too, if he decides that his life is just his and the army's. When he forgets that he is a part of everyone and everything at home, and that all of that is a part of him, well, most any-
