Pheasant Season To Open Saturday

Right on the heels of the deer season comes the opening of the pheasant and quail season in Morrow county, which runs from Oct. 16 to 31, inclusive. Counties open on that date for pheasant besides Morrow are Lake, Harney, Crook, Klamath, Deschutes, Jefferson, Wasco, Sherman, Wheeler, Grant and Gilliam. Bag limit is four male pheasants in any one day but not more than eight such birds in any seven consecutive days or in possession at any one time.

The quail season opens in Morrow, Wasco, Klamath, Harney, Gilliam, Sherman, Grant Lake and Wheeler counties. Bag limit is 10 California or valley quail in any one day or in possession at any one time.

The migratory game bird season opens Oct. 15 and continues through Dec. 23, both dates inclusive, for ducks, geese, brant and coot.

FACTS ABOUT BUTTER

It is a serious question today as to how to meet the dietary need for fat and to what extent butter should be considered essential in the diet, or whether it can be replaced by other fats.

It is important in point buying to plan in order that you can have some butter for each member of your family and then to make every bit of it count in your meal planning and preparation. Don't waste any of this precious food that contributes so much in the way of nutritional and growth promoting factors as well as good flavor.

Whole milk can help protect meals short in butter—a whole quart holds the equivalent of about three tablespoons of butter and will help protect against possible shortages of any unknown food factor in butter. Part of this quart can be used in molasses rice pudding that the whole family can eat.

MOLASSES RICE PUDDING
 6 tbsp washed rice, 2¼ cups milk, 3 eggs, separated, ¼ tsp salt, ¼ cup molasses, ½ tsp cinnamon, ¼ cup granulated sugar.

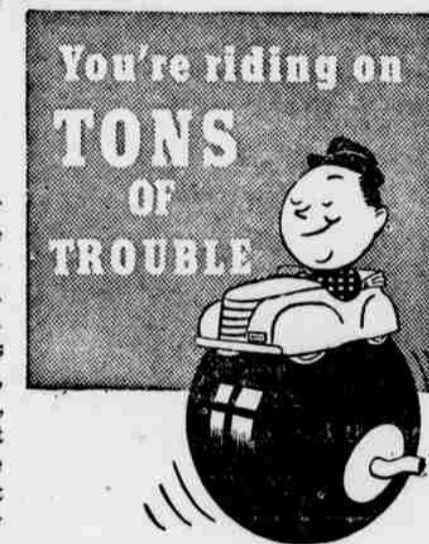
Cook rice in milk in double boiler for one hour stirring occasionally. Beat egg yolks; add salt, molasses and cinnamon. Add hot rice mixture gradually while stirring; return to double boiler and cook two minutes. Cool slightly. Beat egg whites stiff; add sugar slowly, while continuing to beat, then fold into pudding. Chill. Serves 6.
