COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

For September, 1943

The minutes of the August, 1943 term were read and approved.

The Court orders that Government trappers, James Chetwood and Joseph Baltrenas, each be paid the amount of \$25.00 per month out of the Rodent fund of the County beginning with the June 1943 salaries and running to and including the July 1944 salaries. This to be in addition to the amount furnished for gasoline.

The Court agrees to contribute the amount of \$250.00 to pay for gasoline used by the Government trappers, when the other funds have been exhausted, provided this amount is matched by the Morrow County stockmen.

It is ordered that the amount of \$10,000.00 out of the Replacement Sinking Fund, be expended for U. S. War Bonds, Series G, on One Thousand Dollar denominations.

The cancellation of the publication and sale of property in lots 5 and 6 in Block 2 of the City of Heppner, less that part occupied by the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co., is hereby ordered be-

cause of incorrect description and a new order drawn up with the correct description.
