Library Receives Set of War Maps

Heppner Public Library has recently received from Remington Rand some new maps which are on display in the library, and which anyone interested is urged to look at and use. These are stratospheric views of the seven major strategic fronts of the war based on views of the world as a sphere, and in all of them the user of the maps is looking toward the enemy.

Among new books received are a new mystery, "Unidentified Woman," by Eberhart, "Indigo," by Weston. "The Mothers," a fascinating tale of the terrible trip made West by the Donner party, written by Vardis Fisher, and two juvenile selections, "Winter on the Johnny Smoker" and "Soldiers, Sailors, Flyers and Marines," a true account of life in these branches told for children.

Mothers who have had problems filling the shoe needs of growing youngsters will welcome the release for the first three weeks of May of low-priced shoes for children in specified sizes. Actually, this OPA action is aimed to help dealers dispose of slow-moving stocks because many parents have been reluctant to purchase less expensive shoes since rationing. Ration-free sales will be restricted to shoes which are priced by dealers at \$1.60 or less per pair and are limited to the following sizes: children's shoes in 8½ through 12, misses' and little boys' shoes in sizes 12½ through 3.

The value of A gasoline coupons will not be changed because of the gasoline reduction which went into effect when the new A-11 coupons became valid on March 22. The reduction is accomplished in this way. The A-11 coupons, each worth three gallons, will have to last three months instead of two. That gives the holder of the basic A ration eight gallons a month for unrestricted family driving. This change amounts to 60 miles less of the monthly mileage allotment.

Three red stamps (worth ten points each) will be validated every two weeks by the OPA. This gives Mrs. America a total of 60 red points every month for the purchase of meats and fats. At present the following red stamps from ration book four are valid and will be good until May 20, A8, B8, C8, D8, E8 and F8.

The importance of Mrs. America's home canned fruits and vegetables as a part of the total amount of processed foods in the national supply is the reason for allocation of sugar for home canning by the OPA at the same rate as last year despite this year's limited supply. Of course stamp 40 in ration book four is good for five pounds of sugar for home canning. In addition, a maximum of 20 pounds of sugar per person will be granted upon application to local OPA boards any time after March 23. OPA pointed out that there will be sufficient sugar for varying canning needs of different families only if none is diverted to other uses.

Your food ration book should be carried with you when you go away for a vacation for if you eat regularly at a hotel or resort you'll need to turn in a certain number of ration points. Now that we're using ten-point food ration stamps, hotel and resort managers will collect ten points per week for canned food and ten points a week for

meats and fats. In case you take meals at the same place for two weeks, 30 points for meats and fats will be collected. Points will not be required if fewer than eight meals are eaten at the same place in one week or if you stay at the establishment less than a week.
