death of his son-in-law, C. R. Pointer, Mr. Cutsforth operated his daughter's ranch until advancing years forced him to retire. For the past few years he has made his home with his children, alternating between the several points where they live, but all the time claimed Lexington as his home.

Born Feb. 2, 1859 in Michigan, he moved with the family to Wisconsin where he grew to manhood. In 1879 the family moved to South Dakota where, on May 19, 1881 he was married to Lily Troupe at DeSmet.
