The following letter was written to an Oregon business man by Almon E. Roth, former president of the Vaupi Coast Shipmen's Association and former president of the San Francisco Employers' Association, now president National Federation of American Shipping.

My dear Tom:
Because of my very high personal regard for Wayne L. Morse, I am taking the liberty of writing you concerning his qualifications for U. S. Senator.

As you probably know, I have been intimately associated with Wayne Morse through my activities in Pacific Coast waterfront labor relations, and more recently as a fellow member of the National War Labor Board. Through these associations I have had an unusual opportunity to judge his character, ability and political philosophy. He rates tops with me in all three respects.

His keen mind, unbounded energy and facility of expression would immediately win recognition from his fellow senators and the American public. If elected he would be a great credit to the State of Oregon.

I understand that it is being charged in some circles that Wayne Morse is a Communist and pro-Bridges. Such talk is sheer nonsense.
