RETURNS TO HEPPNER

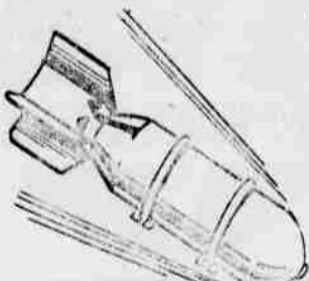
R. L. Beard returned Thursday from Sacramento, Calif. where he spent the winter, and expects to remain here for some time.

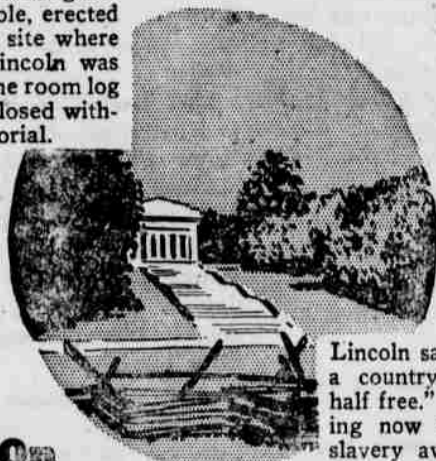

Hearings involving different persons and various motor transportation interests in the central Oregon country have been set down for July 11 at Condon, when examiners representing Public Utilities Commissioner George H. Flagg will be in attendance.

A. L. Casebeer and Marvin Casebeer are asking a permit to extend the operations of their Gray Rock Stages to make calls at John Day. They now operate as common carriers between Heppner, Arlington and Fossil.

D. P. Nicholson has an application pending to allow him to acquire the carrier rights held by Marjorie B. Nicholson in Gilliam Grant and Wheeler counties. He resides at Fossil.

Third hearing of the day concerns the desire of Everett Harshman of Heppner to engage in hauling of general commodities in the region surrounding his home town for 50 miles in any direction.

Utility hearings are always open to the public and any citizen is welcome to appear as a witness on behalf of himself, or the community whose interests the commissioner seeks to serve.
