## Ten Do's and Don'ts **Paper Shortage Grows Acute!**

- 1—Don't wrap or bag an article which is already so packaged that the customer can carry it safely.
- 2-Make each bag carry its full load. Don't use a large bag or sheet of wrapping paper when a small one will do Fill bags already furnished customers for additional purchases.
- 3-Avoid wrapping truck delivery which can be carried safely without wrapping. When wrapping is needed, use salvage material if possible.
- 4-Wrap only for protection, not appearance. Don't use a bag within a bag.
- 5-Ask customers to bring own paper bags in which to package their purchases and shopping bags in which to carry them.
- -Reuse customers' containers in making exchanges and adjustments. 7-Reuse all usable boxes and wrapping materials received from supplies.
- 8-Don't over tape or over seal packages.
- 9-Avoid the use of gift wrapping paper and tissue stuffing in gift packages except when required for protection.
