## Ella Sproule versus the "Horseless Carriage"

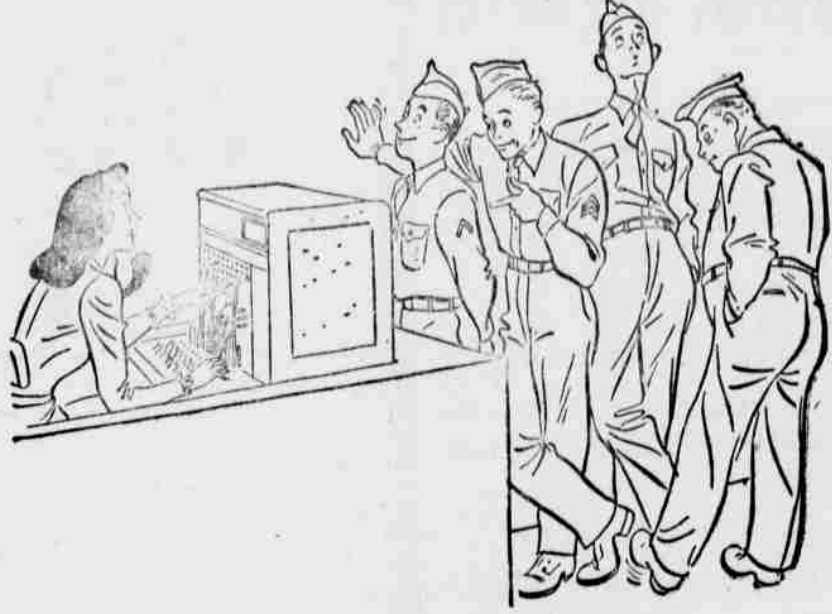
Miss Ella Sproule is a town legend. Never could get used to automobiles. Said there ought to be a law to ban the pesky things.
