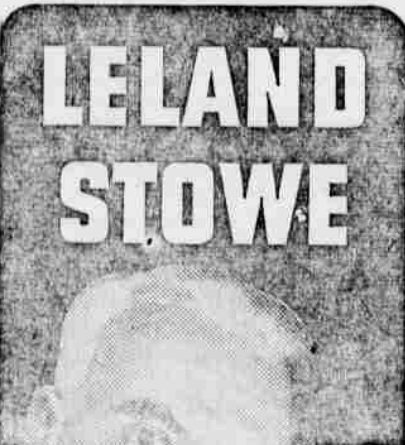
ATTENDS PARTS MEETING
