

**Bishop Dedicates Building Anew**

At a special evening prayer service Sunday, Bishop William P. Remington of the eastern Oregon diocese dedicated to the service of God the recently completed alterations and redecorations of All Saints Episcopal church in Heppner. A capacity audience, swelled by groups from other churches dismissed for the occasion, heard the bishop in the brief dedication ceremony and later deliver a sermon bearing on the same subject.

The present structure was built and dedicated in 1904, taking the place of the original structure destroyed in the flood of 1903. The parish house was a development

of later years, arising from a necessity for a place to hold church worship.

Bishop Remington paid a high compliment to Archdeacon Blunt and his co-worker, Rev. Bennie Howe, for the high quality of work done and the beauty resulting therefrom. He said he regarded it one of the most beautiful houses of worship within the diocese.

A social hour followed the service, a large part of the audience assembling in the parish house where Mrs. Remington and Mrs. Theodore Barber presided at the tea table. Tea, coffee, sandwiches and cookies were served. Before the assemblage broke up, Mrs. Remington presided at the piano and led in community singing.
