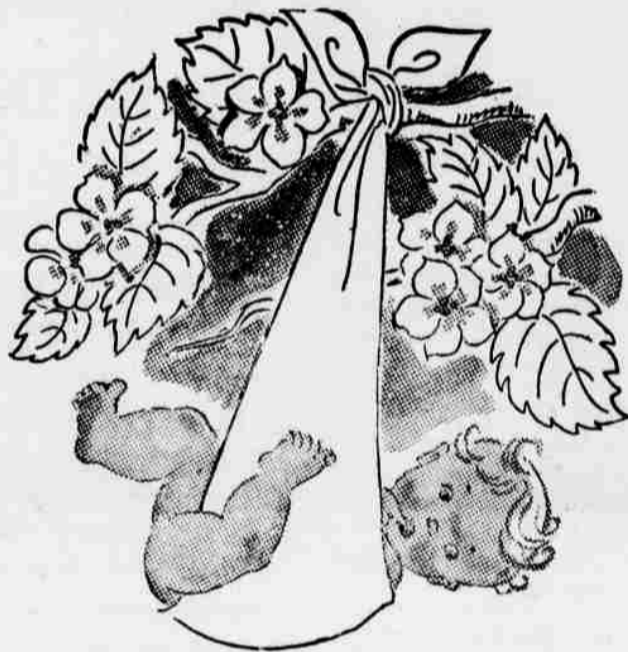
Dean Moore and family went to Pendleton for a week's vacation. They were accompanied by Mrs. Moore from Pendleton.

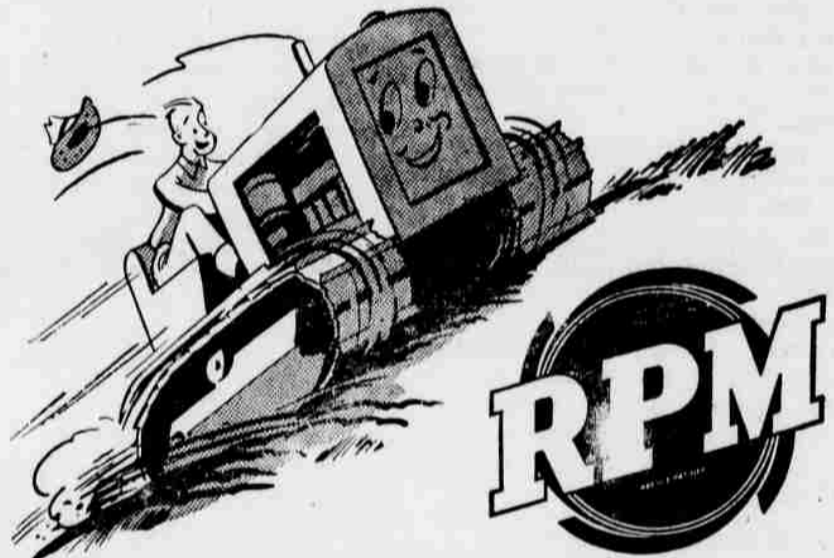

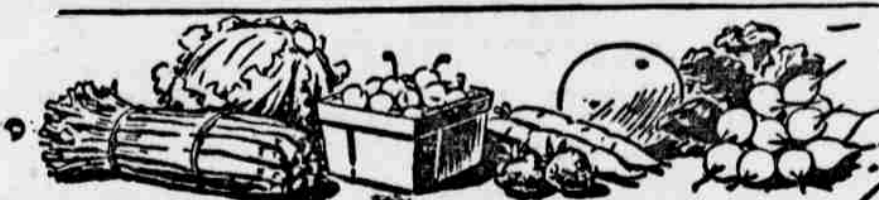
