Dagmar Skoubo accompanied her parents home Friday night. Dagmar has been residing with Bishop and Mrs. W. P. Remington the past

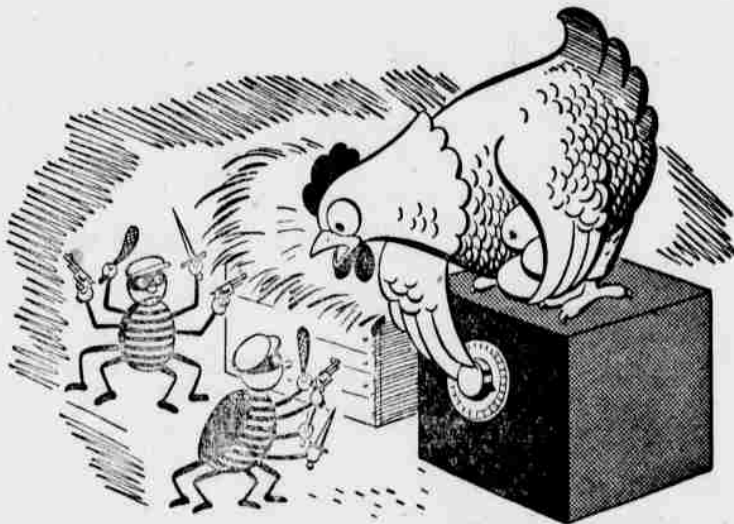
school year.
