

### Vacationers Urged To Use Extreme Caution in Woods

Fourth of July vacationers, expected to use the forest areas of Oregon in large numbers next week, will enter forest lands when the red warning flag of fire is flying, according to Judge Bert Johnson, chairman of the Morrow county Keep Oregon Green association.

Intense heat of the past few days has dried out the grass and fuel in timber areas to create a real fire hazard, the KOG county chairman pointed out. "I join with Governor Snell, State Forester Rogers and Keep Oregon Green officials in urging the public to use extreme caution while in the woods this year," he said. "Many people will be enjoying the great outdoors on camping and picnicking trips who haven't been in the woods since the war. These people may forget what one careless match will do, or how much deviltry one unguarded or improperly put out camp fire can cause."

The local Keep Oregon Green leader urged these simple cautions for all Oregonians and visitors who will enjoy our great forests: Be sure you have ax and shovel with you when traveling in the woods; never leave a camp fire until you are certain it is completely extinguished; don't smoke while traveling in the forests and if you smoke while resting be sure your stub has been ground out into mineral soil; and don't fail to report any fire at once to the nearest fire warden. "Anyone seeing any strange objects should report them at once to the nearest police officer or fire warden and post a guard to make sure that any explosive device does no harm to unsuspecting adults or children," cautions State Forester Nelson S. Rogers.

"We can make Oregon fire-free this Fourth of July, if we try," Governor Snell said as he urged great caution to prevent conflagrations during these trying war times

Mr. and Mrs. Albert Schunk have received word from their son Herbert informing them that he is now in Germany.

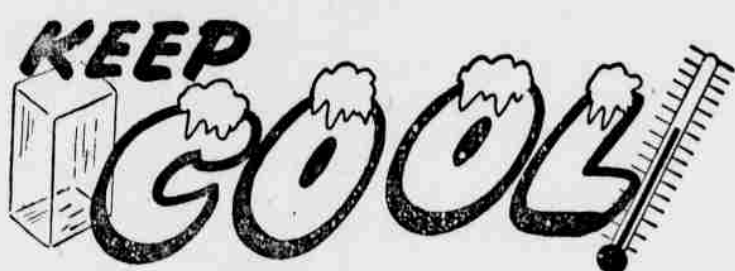
