Albert Ball, Melvin Carlson and Archie Jones who are employed at Milton spent the week-end at home.



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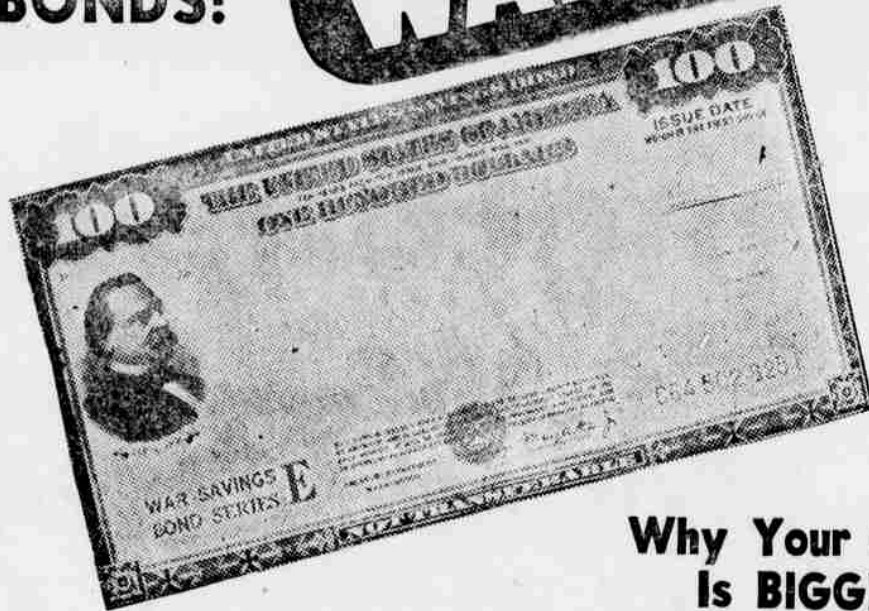
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
