WHITE SAUCE

3 tbs flour, 3 tbs butter, 1 1/2 cups milk, 1/2 tsp salt
Blend flour and butter. Add milk and salt and cook slowly, stirring until thickened. To give extra color and flavor, sprinkle a little paprika or chopped parsley over sauce and cauliflower.

SOUR CREAM SAUCE

2 egg yolks, 3/4 cup sour cream, 1 tbs lemon juice, 1/2 tsp parsley, 1/4 tsp paprika, 1/4 tsp salt
Combine egg yolks and cream. Cook, stirring constantly, until the sauce begins to thicken. Remove from fire, add lemon juice, parsley, paprika and salt.

MUSTARD SAUCE

1/4 cup vinegar, 1 tbs brown sugar, 1/2 tsp mustard, 1 egg 1/2 tsp salt, 2 tbs butter
Heat vinegar and brown sugar together and add this and the mustard to beaten egg. Cook in double boiler until thickened to a soft custard. Add the salt and beat in butter.

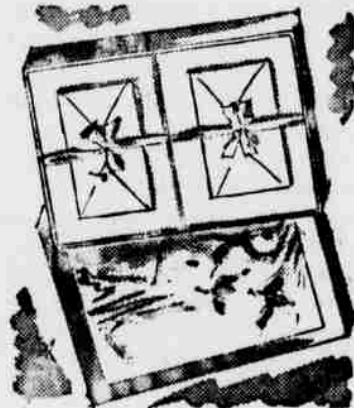
