

## Oregon Youths Win Awards As Best Junior Gardeners

OREGON youths captured the national championship and other major awards for efficient production and marketing in the fifth annual National Junior Vegetable Growers Association contest which attracted entries in 46 states.



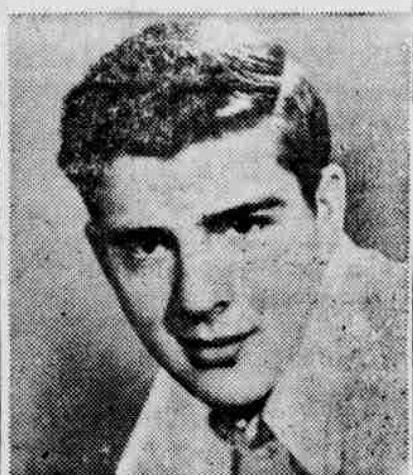

James L. Ammon, 18, R. 2, Albany, was named 1945 national champion to receive a \$500 scholarship, it was announced at the association's 11th annual convention in Cincinnati, O., by the junior growers' adult advisor, Prof. Grant B. Snyder of Massachusetts State College. Jack Grenz, 16, R. 2, Albany, was named champion in the Western Region to receive \$200 from the \$6000 in scholarships provided by the Great Atlantic & Pacific Tea Company. Another Oregon winner is William Lane, 18, R. 2, Boring, who receives a \$100 sectional scholarship.

The new national champion, son of Mrs. Mary Ammon, started gardening five years ago with a plot 50 feet square but in 1945 he used 14 acres of his 68-acre farm for vegetables. As his family's major support, Ammon harvested more than \$5300

worth of truck crops including 110 tons of carrots for canning. He recently was one of 32 Oregon youths who received the state F.F.A. "Farmer Degree," and has accumulated more than a hundred show awards for produce and livestock.

Grenz, son of William F. Grenz, had five acres of produce which yielded nearly \$2,000 in returns. As a senior in high school he plans to get college training. Sectional winner Lane is the son of George F. Lane and lives on a 10-acre farm. He has completed more than 40 4-H Club projects and plans to expand his crop production in 1946 with an irrigation well and water system.

Two Oregon girls won \$25 victory bonds as state winners. They are Marjorie Zeller, 15, of Brockway, and Barbara Densmore, 15, of R. 3, Scio. Awards were distributed to members 12 to 21 years of age throughout the 46 states.

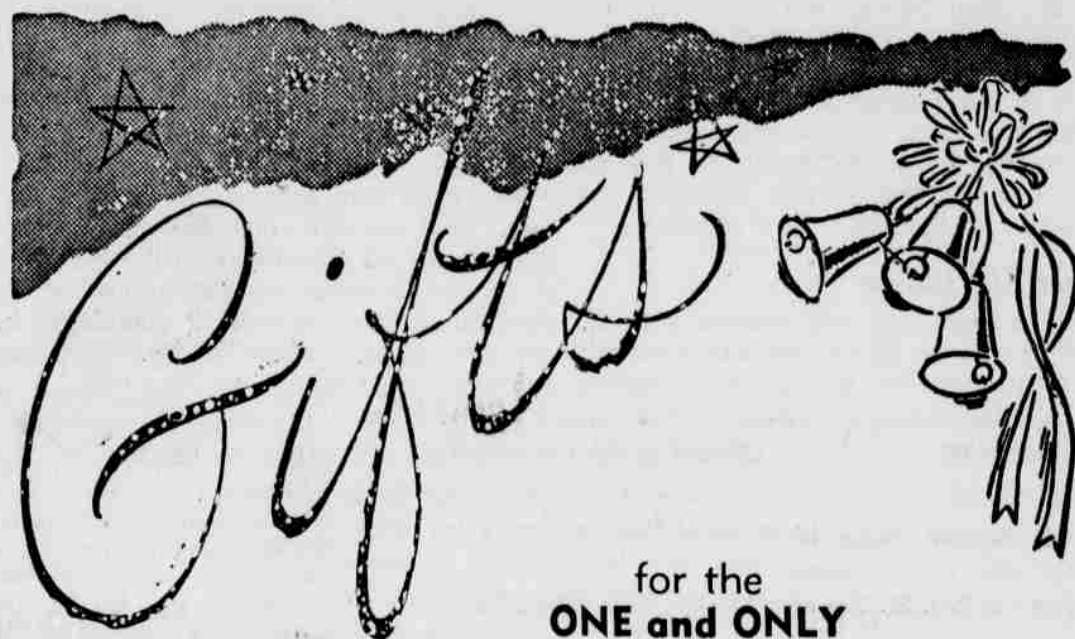
