

### School District Only True Democracy Says Judge Bert Johnson

Singing of the Star Spangled Banner sung by the audience, followed by the flag salute opened the January meeting of the Heppner P-T A held Wednesday evening, January 9, in the music room. The regular business meeting was conducted by President Harold Becket, after which a very enjoyable program was given.

Terry Thompson delighted everyone with a piano solo, "Petite Mazurka", but could not be prevailed upon to give an encore. Mrs. Robert Walker favored the group with a solo "Prayer for a Home" by Klemm. She was accompanied by Miss Marie Barlow.

Judge Bert Johnson was the speaker of the evening, giving a most interesting and worthwhile talk on "Citizenship." He stressed the fact the school district is the only true democracy in the United States and everyone should exercise his right by attending and participating in the meetings instead of "sidewalk" criticisms afterwards.

The necessity of discipline and of its beginning in the home was emphasized by the speaker as a necessary qualification for becoming a good citizen, also the need for better cooperation among parent, teacher and school board to maintain a school that will uphold the highest standards of citizenship. He also urged that all children attend Sunday school. He called attention to the "Keep Oregon Green"

program, pointing out that carrying out their program is one of the duties of being a good citizen.

He summed his talk up in "Do unto others as you would have others do unto you", and we would have citizens of the highest status.

An arithmetic exhibit of both work and texts was on display, showing some very excellent work done along that line in all the grades.

Passing of another Morrow county pioneer was recorded with the death of Frank P. Farnsworth Sunday morning, Jan. 6. Mr. Farnsworth passed away at the home of his sister, Mrs. L. E. Bisbee, where he had made his home in recent months.

Services were held at 2:30 o'clock p. m. Tuesday from the chapel of the Phelps Funeral Home, Archdeacon Neville Blunt officiating. Mrs. Ture Peterson sang, accompanied by Mrs. C. C. Dunham. Interment was made in the Heppner Masonic cemetery.

Frank Pray Farnsworth was born March 19, 1874, in Portland, Oregon and came to Morrow county as a young child. His parents, the late Mr. and Mrs. O. E. Farnsworth,

were pioneers of the Rhea creek hood. On Sept. 20, 1904 he was section where Frank grew to manhood. He was married to Miss Ethel Stewart and they went to the Okanogan country in Washington to make their home. It was there that tragedy struck in 1925, Mrs. Farnsworth losing her life in a fire that destroyed their home. Mr. Farnsworth

later returned to Heppner to reside, for many years occupying the family residence in south Heppner until it was sold.

Surviving are three sisters, Mrs. J. W. Beymer of Oregon City, and Mrs. L. E. Bisbee and Mrs. S. M. Morgan of Heppner, a brother Karl W. Farnsworth of The Dalles, and four nephews and three nieces.
