Oregon's monthly payroll for December dropped \$1,000,000 from figures for the previous month and are down \$25,000,000 from those of December 1944. Oregon Motor Stages and Pacific Trailways have asked Public Utilities Commission-

er George H. Flagg for a hearing to reconsider the new low rates ordered into effect at the request of the Pacific Greyhound bus system.
