Mrs. John Hiatt and her daughter, Mrs. Hubert Gaily went to Portland this afternoon to spend a few days visiting.

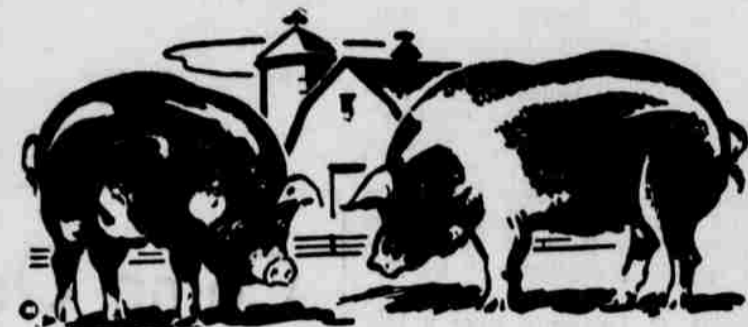
