Word has been received here from the National American Red Cross headquarters that Mrs. Elaine S. George, manager of the Star Theatre in Heppner, has been made the Oregon representative in the 24 Hour club.

Mrs. George was given the signal honor by the motion picture industry for her participation in the 1946 Red Cross Theatre Collection drive. Mrs. George, through her friendship with her many patrons, was able to collect the largest increase for the Red Cross Theatre collection drive over the last year of any of the other 223 theatres in Oregon.

For this accomplishment, Mrs. George is the Oregon representative in the 24 Hour club. She, or her husband, will go to Los Angeles to compete with the winners of the four northwest states for the honor of representing the Pacific northwest. That winner will be sent to Washington D.C. to meet President Harry S. Truman in the White House. They will confer and plan the 1947 program.

Mrs. George, a native of Heppner, has been in the theatre business all of her life. Her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Bert Sigsbee, took over the Star Theatre in 1918. A graduate of Heppner high school and of the Northwestern School of Commerce in Portland, Mrs. George recently received the U. S. Treasury Silver award for services rendered in war bond sales during the war.

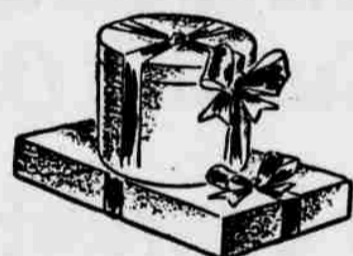

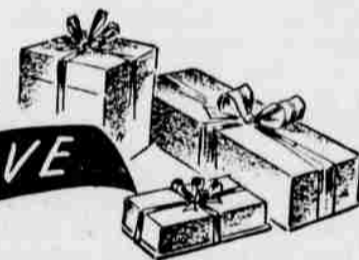
