**Resolution Asks Resurvey of Sugar**  
The following resolution was adopted unanimously by the Oregon State Grange executive committee at its meeting in Portland July 8. Because of its importance to producers and consumers alike it is being given wide publicity, according to Ben Buisman, editor of the Oregon Grange Bulletin.  
**CANNING SUGAR**  
Whereas the present sugar allocation for home canning is entirely inadequate to care for home canning needs, and  
Whereas, even at this early date in the season, there is a considerable wastage of fresh fruits now ripening, due to lack of canning sugar by housewives, and  
Whereas this is resulting in depressed market prices for a number of products, and  
Whereas there are conflicting reports as to the amount of sugar on hand in this country, therefore  
Resolved, by the executive committee of the Oregon State Grange that we ask our delegation in Congress to request an immediate resurvey of sugar stocks and allocations with the purpose of increasing sugar allotments for home canning purposes; and be it  
Resolved, further, that a copy of this resolution be sent to each of the Oregon delegation in Congress and to the National Grange.
