

COUNTY COURT REPORT FOR AUGUST, 1946

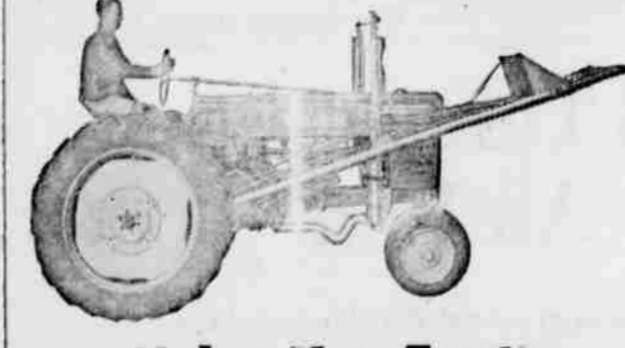
