67-Year Resident Of County Passes
Graveside services were held at 2 o'clock p.m., Sunday, Mar. 2, at the I.O.O.F. cemetery at Ione for W. A. Thomas, pioneer citizen of the county whose death occurred Feb. 27 at the hospital in Hermiston. The Ione I.O.O.F. lodge was in charge of the service.
Born July 17, 1847, in Cleveland, Ohio, Mr. Thomas was 99 years, 7 months and 9 days of age at time of death.
He came to California at the age of 19 years and in 1880 came to Oregon and settled on a farm three miles southeast of Cecil in Morrow county. He continued farming until his health failed. He then moved to Ione and lived there until he was taken to the hospital in Hermiston.

Mr. Thomas joined the I.O.O.F. at Weston in 1882, later transferring his membership to the Ione lodge. He was the oldest member of the order in Oregon. He was married in 1908 and to this union were born two daughters, Lillian Walker of Portland and Grace of Camas, Wash., who survive. He is also survived by six grandchildren. A brother and two sisters live in California.
