At a meeting of the Morrow county 4-H council, held at the county agent's office Saturday afternoon, March 22, plans were laid for 4-H activities for the remainder of the club year. Council members Mrs. Jean Nelson, Mrs. L. A. McCabe, Mrs. Harold Becket, Mrs. Lucy Rodgers, Jo Anne Graves, Faye Cutsforth, B. C. Pinckney and Louis Carlson were present. Election of officers was held as the first order of business with Mrs. Jean Nelson elected president, Louis Carlson vice-president, Jo Anne Graves secretary, and B. C. Pinckney treasurer.
Among activities discussed were plans for selecting 4-H summer school delegates, county fair exhibits and operation of Bodes hamburger stand.
The next meeting of the council will be held on Saturday, Apr. 19.

The first April home extension unit meetings will start at 1:30 Friday, April 4, in Ione at the Congregational church. Rooms Mrs. Emma H. Little, extension specialist in family relationship, will discuss the April project, "Developing Charm and Personality."
On April 10 the Heppner home extension unit will meet at the Pat McIntyre home at 12 noon for a potluck dinner. April 11 the Lexington home extension unit will meet at the Ladies Aid room at 1:30 p.m. All homemakers are invited to attend these meetings.

People who wish to order farm building plans from Oregon State college will be interested in a new book just received by the county agent's office. The book contains copies of plans for a wide variety of structures, ranging from farm labor houses to vegetable storage bins, buck rakes, and crop dusters. In the past it has been necessary to select plans on the basis of mimeographed descriptions.
Now it is possible to inspect the actual plans and select the one that best fits the particular location and purpose desired.
The Morrow county plan book contains 64 plans covering the following items: Sheep feeders, farm labor houses, community halls, barns and stables, lambing sheds, veterinarian sheep barn, arm freezer, truck buck rakes, fruit and vegetable storage, silage racks, poultry houses, machine sheds, farm shops and garages, granaries, smoke houses.

May 1 will be the last day the Morrow county farmers and ranchers can sign up to cooperate in the 1947 agricultural conservation program, Henry Baker, chairman of the county AAA committee, has announced.

LEGISLATIVE SESSION
RETARDS PRINTING OF ANGLING SYNOPSIS
In answer to the numerous inquiries regarding the 1947 angling regulations, the game commission advises that the state printing office has had to delay the printing of the angling synopsis until the present legislative session adjourns because of the pressure of work brought about by the legislature. The synopsis will be printed and distributed as soon as possible and should be available prior to the opening of the general angling season.
Opening of the trout season falls on April 26 throughout the state with certain exceptions, including tidewater areas, Lake and Harney counties and various lakes and streams having special seasons or closures. The trout season in tidewater sections will open on June 15, in Lake county on May 20, and in Harney county on May 31.
Cloth signs have been sent out to commission fieldmen for use in posting waters that are closed to angling or that have special seasons.
