Lack of Splash

Guards Will Get

Motorists in Bad

Fines and jail sentences await drivers and owners of cars not equipped with fenders or splash guards by the end of August, motorists are being reminded by Robert S. Farrell Jr., secretary of state.

The only exceptions to the requirement are vehicles such as log trucks which cannot practically be equipped with fenders, according to an opinion by Attorney General George Neuzer.

Passed by the 1947 Oregon legislature, the legislation applies to all personal or business cars, motorcycles, trucks, busses, or trailers. Guards or fenders must be constructed so as to prevent mud and similar matter from being splashed or thrown on to other vehicles which may be following.

"The rule is a protection not only to motorists from mud and rocks," Farrell said, "but also to pedestrians. A person who might otherwise be drawn under the car when hit by a bare tire could be brushed aside by a fender."

Safety men have lauded the law.

Violators are subject to a fine of as much as \$100 and 30 days in the county jail.
