

**County Court Proceedings for August, 1947**

The minutes of the July 1947 term were read and approved in compliance with Section 8 of Chapter 564, Oregon Laws 1947, based on the fees of the first six months of 1947, the Court hereby orders that the sal-

aries of the Districts to be set at \$15.00 per month and that the salary of J. O. Hager, Justice of Peace of the Sixth District be set at \$53.90 per month, both of said salaries to begin with the month of August, 1947. The Court orders the following Bangs' Disease claims paid: Newton O. O'Harra, \$64.00; Fred Pettyjohn, \$24.00.

Mr. and Mrs. Fred Ross have leased the lunch counter at J. Devine ranch, is now operating a barber shop in the Washington town.

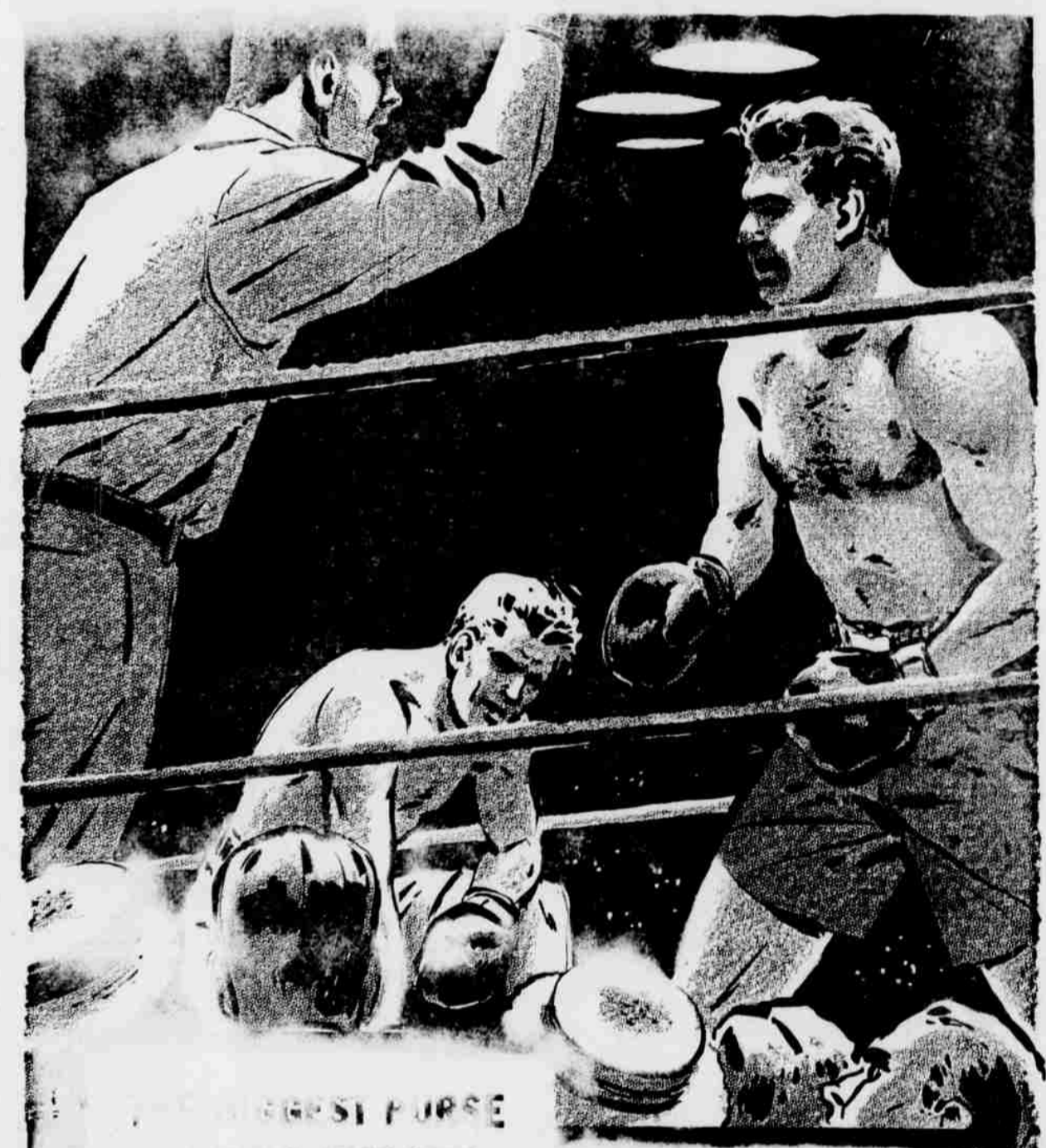
